The Institute for the Psychoanalytic Study of Subjectivity is beginning its fourth year of an advanced seminar for post-certificate psychoanalysts interested in recent developments in self psychology and intersubjectivity.

Requirements

The requirements of the program include a certificate from a psychoanalytic institute, a working knowledge of self psychology, and substantial clinical experience. The course work consists of one class per week over one academic year. Classes will be held on Tuesday nights from 8:00-9:30 p.m. and will cover theoretical innovations in the general arena of self psychology from Kohut's original theories to the present. Classes will be followed by an opportunity for discussion and clinical applications of the theoretical material.

Application Procedure and Fees

Applicants are asked to submit evidence of their analytic certification. A non-refundable \$100 application fee must accompany the application form. Cost per semester is \$975. Applicants will be interviewed by one member of the Coordinating Committee of the training program. WEEK 1 & 2 – SEPTEMBER 15-22

OVERVIEW OF CLINICAL INNOVATIONS SINCE KOHUT

The course initially examines Kohut's seminal theoretical and technical contributions to his psychology of the self in the broad sense. Contributions of subsequent self psychologically-oriented authors such as George Atwood, Howard Bacal, Beatrice Beebe, Bernard Brandchaft, James Fosshage, Frank Lachmann, Joseph Lichtenberg, Donna Orange, Paul Ornstein, Anna Ornstein, Morton Shane, Estelle Shane and Robert Stolorow will be discussed. Finally the course focuses on seeing how the theories of these different authors modified and elaborated Kohut's ideas.
